



Revised Ph.D. Requirements 2009



The Doctoral degree requires 58 hours of 600 and 700-level coursework. Each student is expected to have completed a series of courses in four areas of expertise: (1) research methods and statistics, (2) criminological theory, (3) criminal justice administration, and (4) law and judicial process.
