The internship experience is typically designed to have students serve in roles that are related to specialty areas such as, research, teaching, and administration. However, the graduate students are encouraged not to limit themselves to these traditional roles. Should they develop an educational experience that would offer equal or greater learning opportunities, they may submit a written description of this experience to the Dean for approval.

Qualifications

The internship is an integral component of the Masters in Forensic Science (MSFS). Students spend a summer (6 credit hours) in a forensic setting, usually in a crime lab, between the first and second years of instruction. This experience provides an invaluable opportunity to develop specialized technical skills, as well as understanding of the operation of a forensic facility.

Academic Requirements and Credit

1. Submit a preliminary report, weekly summaries and a final report detailing your experience in your internship.
2. Credit – not to exceed six hours. Additional hours must be approved through the Associate Dean for Administration.
