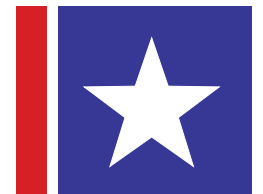

**IAI Certification**

Certification Exams will be given on Friday, October 1, 2010, at Sam Houston State University. Certification applications must be received by September 15, 2010, to be considered to take the exam.
